

Costings

Placement Fees £2,205 per family consisting of one parent and one child

£2,800 per family consisting of two parents and one child

Placement fees include:

- Full Assessment of the family's needs
- Providing Monitoring, Support, Guidance and 24 hour 'on call' Advice Service
- Maintenance of furniture and large electrical items eg washing machine, fridge, television and residents' computer.
- Attending Looked After Children Reviews, Case Conferences and Progress Meetings,
- Contribution to the use of interpreters (up to 3hrs per week)
- All Placement meetings,
- Up to 5 days attendance at court (whilst the placement continues)
- Attendance at Court after 5 days £25 per hour
- Property Insurance
- Full Housing Management
- Repair/Maintenance of Communal Furniture
- Administrative services
- Maintenance of gardens and pathways
- Maintenance and Repair of central heating, gas and electricity services

The placement fee does not include charges in respect of, additional waking night cover, or supervised contact outside of the unit during the placement.

A weekly retainer of 50% of the weekly maintenance fee will be charged -

- a) If Grange Park is asked to hold a placement open for a period longer than 7 days before a family moves in, or
- b) In the event that the placement is cancelled without sufficient notice.

**Grange Park will keep accurate logs/ records of each individual session undertaken with families.*

There will be an expectation that at the mid point of the assessment process a meeting will be arranged to review the findings and ensure that any necessary amendments to the plan are made.

The Accommodation

Our accommodations are individual flats based in the Croydon area. They are fully furnished to a high standard and are particularly for families moving on from parenting assessments who have progressed well and have shown some ability to live semi-independently. Hence the service users experience a significantly increased level of independence as they are responsible for their own property and all that goes with living semi-independently.

Community Support Packages

The basis of our Aftercare Support is a formal system of needs assessment and care planning, involving a range of levels of key-worker contact. We aim to work in partnership with the local authority and service users to assess the ongoing needs of the family within the community and devise individual care plans/agreements that meet their identified needs over an agreed period of time. (in some cases up to eighteen months) We provide a positive and supportive living environment to encourage the continued development of independent living and social skills in order to make a smooth and successful transition to becoming competent parents. All our staff will be familiar with the individual family's Care Plan and with the targets that have been set.

Our Aftercare Support Packages are also based on the principal that support packages are designed and progressed in a manner that is empowering to parents and that increases their self-esteem and confidence. Clear interim targets and goals will be set and assessed on a regular basis

Areas where a service user may continue to need follow up support are:

- Parenting skills eg behaviour management, routines, child development
- Building Confidence and Social Skills
- Budgeting skills /Opening Bank Accounts
- Nutrition and Cooking
- Overcoming Barriers to Social Exclusion
- Applying for jobs/ Interview Techniques
- Accessing Health Services
- Benefits/Housing Advice

- Access to Further/ Higher Education / Training
- Accessing Community Groups/ Citizen Advice Bureau
- Building effective support networks
- Sex and Relationship Advice
- Ongoing psychological support
